



# 5th Street & 6th Street One-way to Two-way Conversion

April 13, 2017 • Open House

## Project Background

The Downtown Boise Implementation Plan, adopted in 2013, laid the groundwork for the one-way to two-way conversions of several streets in downtown. In 2016, ACHD conducted a study to determine the feasibility of converting 5th Street and 6th Street from one-way to two-way at the request of the City of Boise.

## Two-way Conversion Feasibility Study

The 5th Street and 6th Street Two-Way Conversion Feasibility Study analyzed the impacts of the conversion of these streets from one-way to two-way as they were not studied as part of the Downtown Boise Implementation Plan.

### Key Finding: Two-way is feasible with tradeoffs

#### Potential Benefits

- Improves the existing southbound PM peak congestion and travel on 6th Street (*Changes to other time periods and directions vary*)

#### Potential Trade-Offs

- Increases delay and queuing at some intersections
- Impacts up to 54 on-street parking spaces



## What is Next?

The project team will review all the comments and make a recommendation to the ACHD Commission this summer. This will be another opportunity for public input.
