

Raised Bike Lanes

- Raised bike lanes are vertically separated from motor vehicle traffic. They are placed adjacent to a travel lane with a mountable curb to allow entry and exit from the bicycle lane for passing other bicyclists or to access vehicular turn lanes.
- At intersections, the raised bike lane can be dropped and merged onto the street, or it can be maintained at sidewalk level, where bicyclists cross with pedestrians.
